VENIPUNCTURE CHECKLIST

| <input type="checkbox"/> | Know the 5 venipuncture sites dentists use (recommended by DOCS) |
| <input type="checkbox"/> | Dorsal Hand |
| <input type="checkbox"/> | Dorsal Forearm (next to thumb- "intern vein"- remember, it rolls) |
| <input type="checkbox"/> | Ventral Forearm above wrist (thumb side) |
| <input type="checkbox"/> | Lateral Antecubital Fossa (thumb side) |
| <input type="checkbox"/> | Medial Antecubital Fossa (pinky side-try this last because more nerves hang out here) |
| <input type="checkbox"/> | Last resort Dorsal Foot in NON-DIABETICS ONLY |



EQUIPMENT TO BRING WITH YOU TO YOUR CLINICAL EXPERIENCE

- Bring an assistant (This helps make sure you are efficient and can get all of your requirements completed. In past courses, the dentists who chose not to bring an assistant were the ones who fell behind in getting their venipunctures because they could not be as efficient. Each procedure took them longer.)
- Loupes
- Comfortable, clinic appropriate clothing, comfortable shoes- (scrubs or business casual, whatever they normally wear in clinic to treat their own patients, no jeans)-disposable gowns will be provided
- Favorite hand pieces, especially surgical hand pieces and burs
- Favorite extraction instruments
- Any favorite composite, finishing burs or prepping burs (we provide a flame shaped carbide for finishing, egg shape carbide, #256 carbide for prepping)
- If you are specific about composite type or certain composite instruments or prophylaxis instruments, bring those as well (we provide all of those supplies, but many items are donated, so we get what we get)
- All instruments are marked and returned at the end of the three days. Instruments may be shared among other providers in the clinic as our instruments are. If you do not want the instruments shared, you will be responsible for having your assistant or yourself sterilize, package and pick up your instruments between patients. Make note, this might inhibit your process. Our goal is to make this environment a team oriented where we all help one another. We all have the same goal of at least 20 successful venipunctures for each dentist.
